

## Snow Patrol

In March this year WO2 Mark Langridge M.C. of the SAS Regiment, spoke at a meeting of the Dilwyn Royal British Legion about his solo journey to the South Pole in 2008, covering some 700 miles and becoming only the 8th person to do so.

This year, on the 11th November Mark, together with Lt. Col. Harry Worsley and four further senior NCO's from the SAS will attempt to walk to the South Pole following the two routes taken by Captain Robert Scott and Roald Amundsen in 1911.

Lt. Col. Harry Worsley's team will follow the Amundsen route and WO2 Mark Langridge, the path taken by Capt. Scott.

The 11th November 2011 celebrates 100 years since the legendary race between Scott and Amundsen to reach the Pole. This year's expedition is taking place to raise funds for injured servicemen and women at the Battle Back Challenge Centre.

Thanks to Tony Price's influence, Mark's Team taking Scott's route, will be carrying a pennant especially commissioned for the Dilwyn Branch of The Royal British Legion, to the South Pole. Upon it's return we hope to display it at the Crown Inn.



It is an interesting fact that the Dilwyn Pennant was made by "Porters" an old established company who produced the flag that Capt. Scott carried to the South Pole a 100 years ago.

We feel very honoured the Dilwyn Pennant will be taken to the Pole, and sincerely thank Lt. Col. Harry Worsley and WO2 Mark Langridge and their teams for agreeing to do so, and wish them every success in this endeavour to complete the journey safely.
